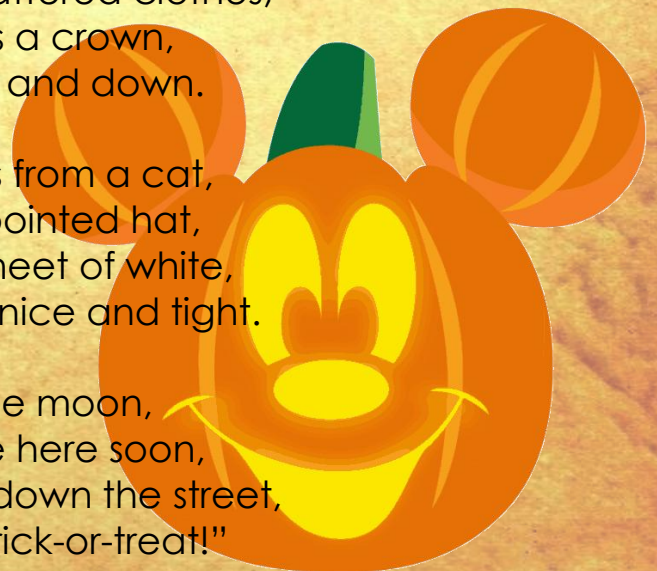

A bunny's ears flop up and down.

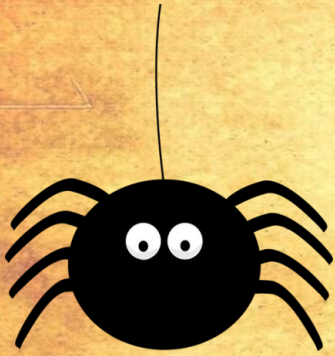
A long black tail swings from a cat,

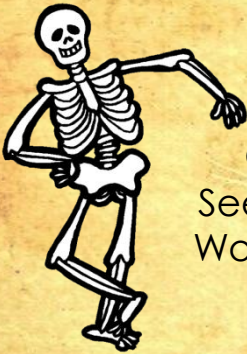
