Welcome back to school. I hope everyone had a great summer vacation.

This month the children will also try to make their own imaginative stories using the puppets. The objective of this activity is to help the children overcome the shyness and improve their confidence through speaking in front of their friends. 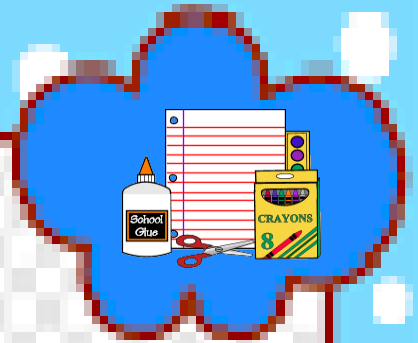
As we had planned, this month will be "Hawaiian Month" the children will learn about the culture of Hawaii. Our crafts and other activities will be related to this theme.

It's not hard to understand

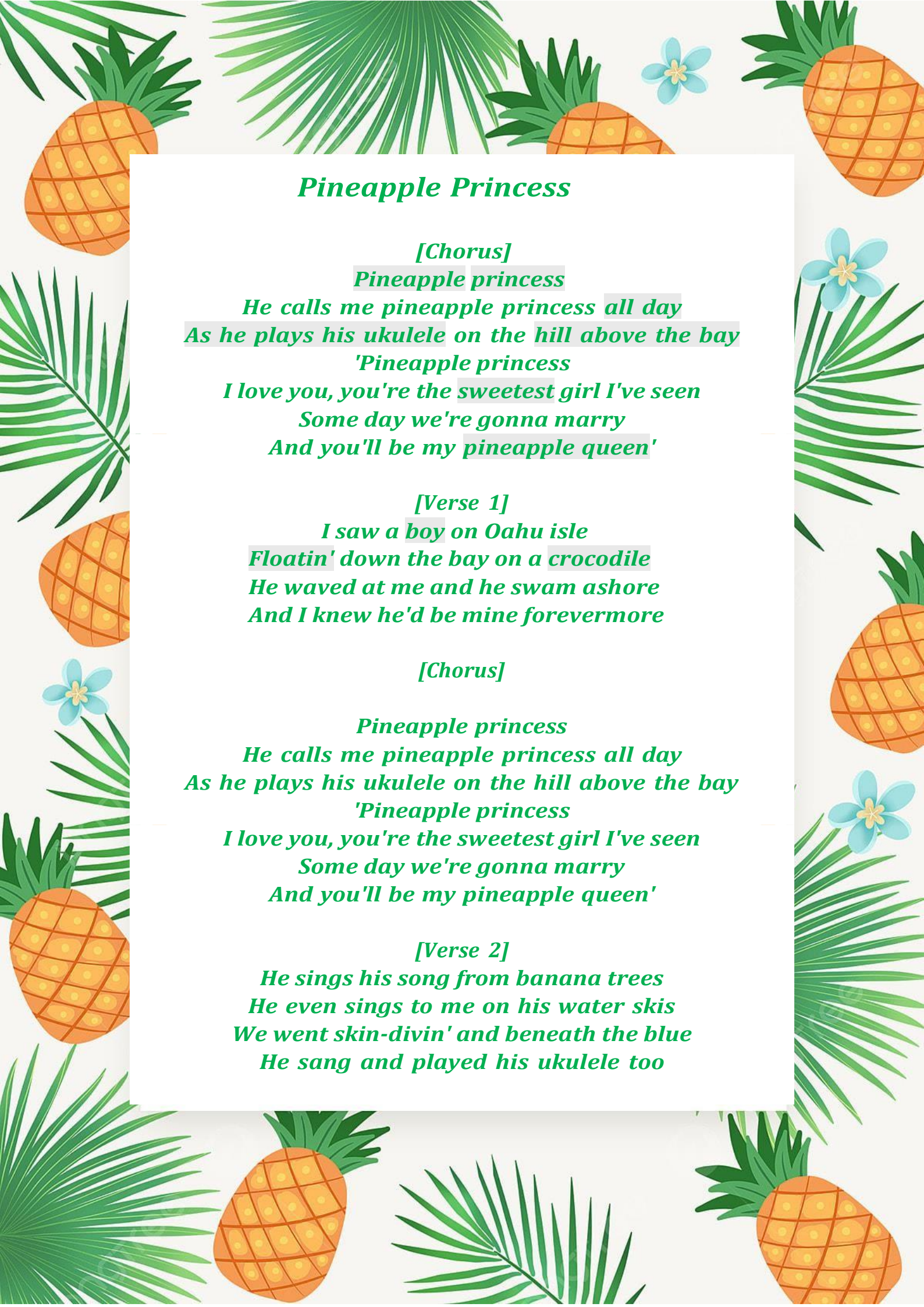
For that wahine is a gal of parts
